


Niilo Johannes Mäki (December 14, 1902, Tampere – December 27, 1968, Jyväskylä) was a Finnish psychologist. He was one of the most developers of neuropsychology and special education in Finland. In 1936, he was appointed as Finland's first psychology professor (acting) at the University of Jyväskylä's Teacher Training College. From 1948 to 1968, he served as the first professor of special education (formerly known as "protective and corrective education") in the Nordic countries at the University of Jyväskylä.

In 1964, he was awarded an honorary doctorate in education.

Priority of interventions

Vasalampi Kati, Academy Research Fellow

Good enough level of (particularly behavioral) engagement in school

Engagement with school starts to loosen

Early signs of school absenteeism (etc. subjective health complaints)

Regular school absenteeism

Dropping out of school and education



MTP: Classroom-level mentoring program to increase teacherstudent interactions (UiS+JyU)



School Work project

New legislation from August 1st this year

"The prevention of absences would mean, for example, creating a school culture that promote students' engagement in school, strengthening emotional and social skills, supporting continuous team-building. systematically monitoring absences and responding early, and collaborating with parents."
